By Design

I can see *By Design* from the Welcome Desk. I can construct a building, code a dance routine or design a tattoo. I can also make designs with magnets on the big wall.



I will then use either the elevator or the pink stairs to go to the second floor.



In Motion

Once on the second floor, *In Motion* will be the first thing I will see. I can create a roller coaster, build a Lego® race car, use a pulley chair or play with scarves in airways. I will make space for others in here and keep my walking feet on while exploring all there is to see.



There is also a place that will hold surprises for me. My grownup can help me decide if I want to explore the traveling exhibit area when we get here. This exhibit changes throughout the year, but it is always something fun.

Digital Dome

If my grownup agrees, we may see a show in the *Digital Dome*. It can be dark in here with loud noises and flashing lights, so I will make this choice depending on how brave I am that day.



There is still so much left to explore! We will make our way to the third floor using the elevator or the stairs.



Our Nature

I can visit Huey the Scarlet Macaw, Verde the Iguana, and lots of other animal friends. I can also pretend to be a wildlife veterinarian. I will keep my hands to myself and try not to make loud noises that can scare my new friends.



Storytelling

It is a little darker in here, but I can tell a story with shadow puppets, practice my reading skills and even pretend to be a character in a play while acting on stage.

Before I play in here, I will stop and get a poncho to help me stay dry. There is so much to do in here, but the floor can get slippery so I will be sure to walk carefully. I can play with a big block of ice or build forts with Legos® on the water



table. I'll be sure to look at the turtles, fish, and even an Axolotl while in here. There is a fog tunnel and a digital aquarium where I can paint my own fish and watch it swim away.
